"I put on righteousness and it clothed me; My justice was like a robe and a turban" (Job 29:14). 🔍

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TRUSTING THE LORD

There are many in the religious world today who claim to trust The Lord. However, upon closer examination, do they really? The Bible says to "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding." (Proverbs 3:5-6). Some lean on their own understanding. To truly trust in the Lord, one must...

Trust in His Purposes. God had a purpose in sending His Son into the world. This purpose was to crush the head of Satan (Genesis 3:15). This purpose was to save man from his sins. "Behold! The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world" (John 1:29). We must also trust in God's eternal purpose for the church. Many do not. God's purpose was for the church to make known the manifold wisdom of God (Ephesians 3:10); to sound forth the Gospel (1 Thessalonians 1:8). But many have neglected this purpose, turning the church into nothing more than a social club, or a playhouse.

Trust in His Precepts. A precept is a direct command or a direct statement. If one really trusts in the Lord, this will be reflected in believing and doing what He says. Jesus said "He who has My commandments and keeps them, it is he who loves Me" (John 14:21).

Many are emphatic in their declaration of love and trust for Jesus, yet they are even more emphatic in denying a simple statement The Lord made in Mark 16:16, "He who believes and is baptized will be saved..." Some have tried to teach that the verse doesn't belong in scripture; others twist the statement beyond recognition. Why not just believe and obey it? Why not just trust Jesus? Baptism saves because it is the point at which we contact the precious blood of Jesus, otherwise, how could it be said to wash away sins (Revelation 1:5; Ephesians 1:7; Acts 22:16; 1 Peter 3:21)? Many trust in their preacher, some scholar, some commentator, a creed book, a tradition, or in what their grandparents believed more than they trust in Jesus.

Trust in His Promises. So many are riding the worry train. They claim to trust Jesus, yet they worry themselves into a stress attack, a heart attack, or an ulcer over how they are going to pay the bills, eat, buy clothes, etc. This worry and anxiety demonstrates a distinct distrust in the Lord. Jesus Has promised that if we'll seek God first in our lives, we will have the things we need (Matthew 6:25, 33). Pray, trust God, and have peace (Philippians 4:6-7). 🔍

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MISPLACED TRUST

It is very clear from God's word that we should always place our trust in God and His word. There are, however, some things in which man will foolishly place his trust. This could cost him his eternal soul.

Consider a couple of things in which we allow our trust in them to trump God's word.

Money. Paul told Timothy to "Command those who are rich in this present age not to be haughty, nor to trust in uncertain riches but in the living God, who gives us richly all things to enjoy. Let them do good, that they be rich in good works, ready to give, willing to share, storing up for themselves a good foundation for the time to come, that they may lay hold on eternal life" (1 Timothy 6:17-19).

Money is something we need in order to obtain the necessities of life. The Bible urges us to be responsible and work in order to provide for our needs and for those of our family (2 Thessalonians 3:10; 1 Tim 5:8).

We should also work so that we may have something to give those who have need; and to give to the Lord (Eph 4:28; 1 Corinthians 16:1-2). But it is a tragic mistake when we place our trust

in money. We cannot buy our way into heaven, and the desire to be rich has caused many to neglect their responsibilities of labor in the kingdom, and even caused many to depart from the faith (1 Timothy 6:8-10).

Don't love money, love God! Place your trust in Him alone (Proverbs 3:5-6). "Commit your way to the Lord, Trust also in Him..." (Psalm 37:5).

Men. We should certainly have respect for our religious teachers and leaders (1 Corinthians 11:1; Heb 13:7, 17). But we should never place our full trust in men, for sometimes men will depart from the truth. As Paul said, we should follow men as long as they are following Christ (1 Corinthians 11:1).

Men's teachings should be compared with God's word to make sure they are accurate (Acts 17:11). If they teach error and do not repent after being properly confronted they should be marked and avoided (Romans 16:17-18).

Benefit from the proper advantages of money and men, but keep your full trust in God! Don't lose your soul because of misplaced trust. 🔍
