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GODLY SPEECH

There are all types of speech and various different languages across the world and across our nation. Each language has its own dialect depending on what part of the country one lives in. Language sets people apart from one another and accents can give away where one is from. To a trained ear, one can tell what State, or even what part of a State you are a citizen in. Should the Christian’s language give him away? Philippians 3:20 tells us that we are citizens of heaven. Should our language not reflect our citizenship? Absolutely! Our language should let people know that We are citizens of heaven; that we are Christians; that we are the people of God. Godly Speech is that which is...

Seasoned With Salt. *“Walk in wisdom toward those who are outside, redeeming the time. Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned with salt, that you may know how you ought to answer each one”* (Colossians 4:5-6). Speech that is seasoned with salt is gracious; not mean-spirited, rude, or even cruel. Salt seasoned speech is also good; not filthy, lewd or impure (Colossians 3:8). It is also genuine. Christians should be known as people who speak the truth. Their words are

honest and dependable. *“Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds”* (Colossians 3:9). Salted speech is also glad. Let the world do the complaining and let the Christian rejoice! (Philippians 4:4).

Sanctified For Service. Our speech should not be like the world’s, it should be set apart, holy, ready to glorify God. Our prayer lives should be active (1 Thessalonians 5:17). We should be speaking the Gospel to our friends, neighbors; etc (Acts 8:4). We should be ready to use our mouths to worship God (Ephesians 5:19; Hebrews 10:25).

Scary To Satan. In the latter part of his famous poem about prayer Cowper wrote, “Restraining prayer we cease to fight, prayer makes the Christian’s armor bright; And Satan trembles when he sees the weakest saint upon his knees.” It’s true; Satan does not want us praying. If you want to defeat the master of evil you must have an active, devoted prayer life. Many passages urge us to pray regularly about all things (Ephesians 6:18, etc.). Someone has said “When Satan knocks you to your knees; he has put you in a perfect position to pray!” But you need to pray before he gets you there! Prayer is an essential part of Godly Speech.

SPIRITUAL CANNIBALISM

We've all heard of cannibalism. Cannibals are savages who actually devour and consume the flesh of other people. This is naturally repulsive to us; but consider something that is really more repulsive and yet not always viewed as such by many "Religious" people – Spiritual cannibalism.

Spiritual cannibalism is practiced with the mouth as well. There's no doubt that Paul had in mind some of the things Christians say to and about one another when he wrote, "But if you bite and devour one another, beware lest you be consumed by one another" (Galatians 5:15).

Words mean something, and how we use our tongues can and will determine where we will spend eternity. "*For by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned*" (Matthew 12:37).

There are many different uses of the tongue which can condemn us: Filthy language and blasphemy (Colossians 3:8), lewd talk, dirty jokes, etc (Galatians 5:19-21), and every type of lie (Ephesians 4:25; Colossians 3:9;

Revelation 21:8). Our concern here is with the type of language that hurts, harms and destroys others.

Paul wrote, "*Let all bitterness, wrath, anger, clamor, and evil speaking be put away from you, with all malice*" (Ephesians 4:31). In speaking of the tongue, James wrote "*Out of the same mouth proceed blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not to be so*" (James 3:10). So before you get into "running down" your brother or sister, or anyone else for that matter, consider the consequences of your words.

Instead of spiritual cannibalism, let's practice spiritual concern and spiritual care with our mouths. "*And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you*" (Ephesians 4:32). Let's speak things that edify and encourage the hearer in a graceful way (Hebrews 3:12-13; Colossians 4:6). We cannot tame the tongue on our own (James 3:8), but with the help and strength of Christ, we can do all things (Philippians 4:13). 🔑
