THREE SECONDS

There are a lot of "Seconds" spoken of in the Bible. Consider the...

Second Commandment. This is found in Matthew 22:34-40 where Jesus is being "Tested" with a question about the greatest. He informed His listeners that the greatest commandment is to love the Lord your God; but the second is like it, "Love your neighbor as yourself." But who is my neighbor? The parable of the Good Samaritan was told in order to answer this very question (Luke 10:29ff). The lesson of the parable is that one's neighbor is not just the one who lives in the house next door; one's neighbor is anyone that we have the opportunity and means to help. This could include our "Enemy." It's easy to love your friends, even those outside of Christ can do this (Matthew 5:46-47), but we must love our enemies as well (Matthew 5:43-45).

Second Covenant. The Bible speaks of two covenants, the Old and the New. They are referred to as the "First" and the "Second" (Hebrews 8:7); the "Old" and the "New" (Hebrews 8:13). The first covenant was that which was given to the children of Israel to rule them (Jeremiah 31:31-34). It was added

"Because of Transgressions till the Seed should come" (Galatians 3:19). Many in religion today want to go back to the first covenant in order to justify some of their religious practices; but the Bible tells us the first covenant has become obsolete (Hebrews 8:13). It's still God's word and it's there to give us examples of disobedience and obedience to God (1 Corinthians 10:11), but as far as being our authority in religion, it has become obsolete.

Second Coming. At the ascension of Christ, two men in white apparel stood by the apostles and told them *"This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven"* (Acts 1:11). No passage teaches that Jesus will ever set foot on this earth again, but when He comes again the faithful saints will meet Him in the air and be joined with Him in heaven forever more. But those who do not know God and who do not obey the Gospel of Christ will be punished with everlasting destruction from the presence of the Lord and from the glory of His power (2 Thessalonians 1:7-9). Many look forward to the second coming with fear and trepidation, but there's no need if you're serving Him faithfully.

NO NEED FOR MAN'S CREEDS

There are many man-made Creed books in religion today. They are not generally brought into the pulpit; but they are found in the offices of the different denominations' ministers; the concepts in them are studied and then implemented into the sermons. To teach anything contrary to these creeds could bring rebuke, discipline, and even sanction.

I wonder about the very existence of these Creed Books. I once heard a man say regarding man-made creed books, "If they say less than the Bible, they say too little; if they say more than the Bible, they say too much; and if they say the same thing as the Bible, there's no need, we have the Bible!" Amen! This is a biblically accurate concept. Paul wrote, "All Scripture in given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work" (2 Timothy 3:16-17). If I need doctrine, I don't need man-made

creeds; Scripture provides all I need to be complete. The same is true for discipline; I don't need the man-made disciplines, or catechisms, etc. I can be a complete man of God with Scripture alone.

Those who go beyond the doctrine of Christ lose their fellowship with God, "Whoever transgresses and does not abide in the doctrine of Christ, does not have God..." (2 John 9). God wants us to worship and serve Him according to what He has revealed in His word, not according to man-made doctrines derived from the wisdom of man. Jesus condemned the religious elite of His day for "Teaching as doctrines the commandments of men" (Matthew 15:9). Man-made creed books distort God's wisdom by either adding to or taking away from His words, or both. "Every word of God is pure...Do not add to His words. Lest He rebuke you, and you be found a liar" (Proverbs 30:5-6). "Indeed let God be true but every man a liar" (Romans 3:4).
