

impossible" (Luke 1:37). This was part of the message given to Marv by the angel when revealing the upcoming birth of Christ. From man's standpoint, it was impossible for her, a virgin, to be with child. We would do well to be reminded that we serve a powerful God. But it is interesting how we sometimes expect things to happen under circumstances that make these things impossible. For example, some expect...

Salvation Without Conformity.

God has made salvation available through Christ Jesus via His death on the cross, but He has also made it clear that we cannot obtain this salvation without conforming to the Gospel of Christ. Jesus became the Author of salvation to all who obey Him (Hebrews 5:8-9). The man-made Gospel of salvation by "Grace only" will not do. Grace was God's part in the scheme of redemption, but man's part is to obey, to do the Father's will (Matthew 7:21). So we are saved by grace (God's part) through faith (Man's part). That is, an obedient faith, not just a mental assent to the Lordship of Christ. The purpose of the preaching of the Gospel is ultimately

"For with God nothing will be for "Obedience to the faith" (Romans 16:26). The Lord said, "He who believes and is baptized will be saved" (Mark 16:16). Those who do not conform to this demand of the Gospel cannot expect salvation. That's impossible! In addition, some expect...


Satisfaction Without Cooperation.

Many are not satisfied with the state of the church. They expect the impossible! They expect to get joy and encouragement from the services without putting something in Themselves (Heb. 10:24-25). They expect the attendance to rise without inviting others to services. They expect more baptisms without trying to teach others. They expect to grow in knowledge without reading the Bible daily and attending the bible classes offered by the church. Impossible! (see Ephesians 4:11-16). Some expect...

Steadfastness Without Conviction.

One wonders why he can't resist temptations more successfully. We are to be faithful till death (Revelation 2:10), and steadfast (1 Corinthians 15:58). This can't be done until we are wholly committed to the cause of Christ. We must search our hearts and make sure we have truly put God first above all else (Matthew 6:33). \swarrow
