## IN THE ASSEMBLIES

Paul was insistent that Timothy be instructed on how to conduct himself in the house of God (1 Timothy 3:15). Although more is included, let's focus on how we should act during worship and Bible study times.

**Be Regular.** *"Not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the day approaching"* (Hebrews 10:25). Some have a hit and miss record when it comes to the assemblies. Maybe they'll be there, maybe not. I wonder if their earthly boss would put up with such. What if their attendance on the job was erratic? What if they never even called when they missed, leaving the boss wondering where they are? Do you think they would be promoted, get a raise, or win employee of the month? No. It's more likely they would be fired. If we're faithful to our job, how much more faithful ought we to be to the assemblies of the saints! "Seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness..." (Matthew 6:33).

**Be Reverent.** Some don't seem to know the difference between the assemblies and a movie, or football game, seeing how they dress when

they "Come to church." Yes, God looks on the heart, but let's not force a meaning on that truth that God didn't intend. He's expressed concern as to how we dress as well (1 Timothy 2:8-9). During services, some seem more interested in what others are doing, or in entertaining the children. Others pass notes, snore, sleep, do homework, text, or even play games. Where's the reverence? Remember, "*God is greatly to be feared in the assembly of the saints, and to be held in reverence by all those around Him*" (Psalm 89:7).

**Be Respectful.** We need to be respectful and decent with other worshipers. Be friendly and courteous. Some offer the "Evil eye" if someone sits in their pew. Others feel irritated because "Hot-natured so-and-so had to have the fans on." Cold shoulders can lead to hot heads and a foul look can breed resentment. Offer a smile rather than a smirk. We should esteem others better than ourselves, looking out for their interests (Philippians 2:3-4). Leave selfishness to the ungodly; let us have the mind of Christ. We should be respectful to the preacher and teacher during worship and Bible study, respectful to our fellow worshiper, and hospitable to our visitors.
