
THE FALL OF ISRAEL

The text of 2 Kings 17 tells of the reason why Israel fell as the Lord “removed them from His sight” (2 Kings 17:18). First, they fell because they imitated the evil of those around them (vss. 7-8). Second, they fell because they practiced idolatry (vss. 9-12). Third, they fell because they rebelled against God (vss. 13-16). Forth, they fell because they sacrificed their children (vss. 17-18).

Many today fall for the same reasons. They imitate those in the world around them, doing sinful things. They practice idolatry, putting other things before the Lord. They rebel against the will of the Lord, refusing to heed His voice. They sacrifice their children through abortion, abuse, and neglect. Let us learn from the fall of Israel and be cautious not to make the same mistakes! -

WHY ATTENDANCE IS ESSENTIAL

Many do not place a great emphasis upon being present when the church comes together. Let's consider from the Bible why attendance is essential...

God Commanded It. Hebrews 10:24-25 commands that we not forsake the assemblies. When we allow things of this world to keep us from attending, we disobey God's command.

To Seek God First. The Lord commanded that we seek first God's kingdom (Matthew 6:33). To make something more important than God and His kingdom is to be guilty of idolatry.

To Worship God. The assembled saints worship God through singing, prayer, Bible study/teaching, observing the Lord's Supper, and giving, all at God's commands (Eph 5:18-19; Eph 4:11-12; Acts 2:42; Acts 12:5; 1 Cor. 11:23-26; 1 Cor. 16:1-2). To be absent is to neglect these responsibilities.

To Follow The Apostle's Example. Through inspiration, Paul commanded, “The things which you learned and received and heard and saw in me, these do, and the God of peace will be with you” (Php 4:9). Paul assembled with the saints (Acts 20:7-12).

To Mature As A Christian. Too many Christians are very weak in Bible knowledge. They neglect daily Bible study and prayer, and they neglect coming together with the saints to study. God has put the assemblies in place in order to help us grow as Christians (Eph. 4:11-16). To neglect attendance is to neglect a God-given opportunity to become strengthened in knowledge.

To Encourage Brethren. We are inconsiderate towards our brethren when we neglect attendance (Hebrews 10:24-25). According to these two verses, when we attend, we (1) Consider one another (2) stir up love and good works in each other (3) Exhort one another.

To Be Encouraged. Not only do we give brethren much needed encouragement when we are present at the gatherings of the church, but we also receive much needed encouragement and exhortation from our brethren. Why would we want to miss out on an opportunity to encourage and be encouraged by the brethren that we are to love?

It is essential for us to be present when the church gathers together! 🔍

DID JESUS USE CARNAL METHODS TO ATTRACT CROWDS?

Many religious groups use a variety of carnal appeals to draw people to their assemblies. For instance, there are suppers and ice cream socials, ball games and entertainment events, etc. When asked to justify these activities they will commonly refer to the episodes where Jesus fed the multitudes. Some have said, 'If you first feed a man's body, then you'll have a chance to feed his soul.' Let's see if their reference to Jesus' activities will really support their practices.

There were two separate instances in which Jesus miraculously fed huge crowds of people with small quantities of food. One time there were 5000 men, plus women and children (Mt. 14:15-21; Mk. 6:30-44, Lk. 9:10-17; Jn. 6:1-14). On another occasion there were 4000 men, plus women and children (Mt. 15:32-38; Mk. 8:1-9).

In both instances, the people had followed Jesus to hear His marvelous teaching and to see His amazing miracles. There had never been a promise of food to draw them. In fact, both episodes show the people following long distances and for a long time before they were offered food. For example, in **Matthew 15:32** we read "Then Jesus called his disciples unto him, and said, I have compassion on the multitude, because they continue with me now three days, and have nothing to eat: and I will not send them away fasting, lest they faint in the way." Do you see it? The people were not lured to follow by an offer of food. The food came AFTERWARDS, as an act of compassion. The people had NOT come in anticipation of being fed.

We have one reference where Jesus suspected that the people did, indeed, come with a desire of receiving food (**Jn. 6:22ff**). On that occasion He DID NOT feed them! Those who would use the example of Jesus feeding the multitudes to justify their carnal practices today are simply wrong! -
