Let's strive to love Jesus truly, according to how He has said we must love Him. 🔍

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SPIRITUAL BLINDNESS

When one is spiritually blind, the results are devastating. Not only does it bring them misery and hopelessness in this life, but it brings everlasting punishment in eternity. One way to avoid and overcome spiritual blindness is to identify the causes. Knowing the source of a problem is the best way to then overcome the problem. Consider from the Bible these causes of spiritual blindness. ...

Some Want to be Blind. Matthew 13:15; 2 Corinthians 4:4. There are some who remain blind to the truth of the Gospel because they simply don't like its message. For this reason, they turn their ears away from the truth and to religious error which is more soothing. They intentionally close their eyes to the light.

Lack of Growth Leads to Spiritual Blindness. 2 Peter 1:5-11. Failing to add all of these essential components to our faith will cause one to be spiritually blind. Due to a lack of study and putting into practice what they learn, they remain weak in the faith and eventually stumble.

Love For Money Leads to Spiritual Blindness. Matthew 6:23. In the context, the "bad" eye is the one that tries to stay focused on a pursuit of material wealth and possessions; so much so that their spiritual service is hindered or prevented altogether halted. You cannot serve God and Riches!

Hatred of Brethren Leads to Spiritual Blindness. 1 John 2:11. If we fail to learn to love our brethren, and to act lovingly toward them, in effect, we are walking in darkness even when we think we are serving the Lord. Our love for brethren should be expressed in patience, kindness, forgiveness, and understanding. In times of need, our love should be expressed in physical and monetary assistance (1 John 3:16-23).

Fleshly Desires Leads to Spiritual Blindness. Ephesians 4:17-24. Our desire for spiritual things can be clouded and snuffed out if we allow ourselves to be overtaken by the fleshly pleasure this world has to offer. The shiny pleasures of this world are unsatisfying and temporary. We must remember that in the end, because of the eternal reward, it is preferable to choose to suffer affliction with the people of God than to be deceived by the passing pleasures of sin (Hebrews 11:25).
