

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A Broken Heart

SOME HAVE HAD THEIR hearts broken by the one they love. This has led to such tragedies as murder and suicide. And yet it has also produced the loveliest of poems and songs. Other hearts are broken through bereavement.

But there is a heartbreak that is commendable—A broken heart like the man in the parable who cried, “*God, be merciful to me a sinner*” (Luke 18:13). Sin should break our hearts. Our spirit should be troubled when we sin against God. Jesus blessed those who mourn over their sin (Matthew 5:4). He promised them comfort.

The mournful realize their poverty of spirit (Matthew 5:1). They know they have sinned against a holy God, perhaps they have contemplated the consequences, and guilt is crushing their spirit and breaking their heart. Good! Now they have incentive to approach God for forgiveness. “*The Lord is near to those who have a broken heart, and saves such as are crushed in spirit*” (Psalm 34:18).

Jesus promised rest for the souls of those who come to Him (Matthew 11:28-30). But how do we come to Him? Those in Acts chapter two had their hearts cut (broken) by the Gospel of Christ. They desired healing from their sin. They were told, “*repent... and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of your sins*” (Acts 2:37-38). Does time heal all wounds? No. Only obedience to the Gospel will heal the wounds of a heart broken by the crushing blow of sin.

Reactions To A Sermon

THE SERMON IS THE one Paul delivered at Mars Hill in Athens, an extremely idolatrous and philosophical city of the first century (Acts 17:16-34). Paul proclaimed to them the true and living God (unknown to them) and the hope of the resurrection (Acts 17:23-24, 31). We are given three different reactions to this sermon...

Some Ridiculed. They “*Mocked*” when they heard about the resurrection (vs 32). They jeered at it, made fun of it, and criticized it. Their philosophical background taught them there was no resurrection. But this was no excuse. When confronted with the truth of the Gospel one is obligated to accept it regardless of what they’ve believed throughout life. There are many today who mock at the truths of the Gospel, often while claiming to be followers of Jesus. For example, when hearing the truth about the necessity of baptism for salvation (Mark 16:16; 1 Peter 3:21), many mock. Those proclaiming that message have been belittled, made fun of, and sometimes cruelly criticized. How tragic to ridicule the words of the Lord Jesus!

Some Reflected. “*We will hear you again on this matter*” (vs 32). At least they were willing to investigate further. It was a strange doctrine to them, one that was challenging and difficult, but they wanted to hear more. It is true that the call of Christ comes with a high price tag. As a Christian, one is open to suffering in various ways—physical persecution, sacrifice of cherished habits and possessions, ridicule and denial from the closest of friends and family (Matthew 5:11-12; 10:34-39; 2 Timothy 3:12). Jesus taught that one should “*count the cost*” (Luke 14:26-28). However, one should not take too long in his reflection and cost counting, and scripture indicates that it doesn’t take much time. Many on this same occasion went ahead and obeyed (vs 34). Three thousand in Acts 2 responded almost immediately, and the Philippian Jailer was baptized in the same hour of the night on which he heard (Acts 16:33).

Some Received. “*Some men joined him and believed*” (vs 34). They did not procrastinate as Felix did (Acts 24:22-25). We have no assurance of being alive tomorrow (James 4:13-17). Today is the day of salvation (2 Corinthians 6:1-2). If you have not obeyed the Gospel, “*Why are you waiting? Arise and be baptized and wash away your sins...*” (Acts 22:16).
